FIRE EMERGENCY AND RESTRICTIVE BURN BAN

For

WARD COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA

April 5th, 2022

WHEREAS, Ward County, North Dakota has endured abnormally dry conditions compiled with high winds; and

WHEREAS, several rural fires have already occurred as a result of the current conditions; and

WHEREAS, the impact of fires could threaten the health, well-being and safety of citizens in Ward County; and

WHEREAS, all available resources remain committed to protecting life and property; and

WHEREAS, the cost of the response and the inordinate equipment wear may be far in excess of available County resources.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Ward County Commissioners declares a Fire Emergency and Burn Ban (to include a ban on garbage/pit burning, campfires, and burning of farm or crop land) remain in effect when the North Dakota Rangeland Fire Danger Rating is in "High, Very High, Extreme", and/or a "Red Flag Warning" has been issued for Ward County, North Dakota. The declaration will remain in place until November 30, 2022.

The use of Fireworks is banned when the Fire Index Rating is "Very High or Extreme" or a "Red Flag Warning" has been issued.

This declaration does not ban the use of grills or commercially sold enclosed fire pits, but is recommended that grills or enclosed fire devise be on non-organic surface and be a minimum of 15 feet away from any vegetation.

THE PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS BURN BAN IS A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC37-17.1-10.1: MAXIMUM SENTENCE OF 30 DAYS IN JAIL AND \$1,500 FINE.)
